Meals on Wheels

Meals on Wheels recipients receive seven frozen meals, a half gallon of milk, and a bag of fruit once a week. The meals are designed to meet the nutritional needs of seniors. Meals on Wheels recipients with extra nutrition needs may be referred to our Medical Nutrition Therapy program for an individualized nutrition intervention. Meals on Wheels' delivery drivers also make weekly wellness check-ups. Case Management services are provided to each senior. In addition to these services, Meals on Wheels recipients with pets receive pet food.

Low-income Nevadans can shop in a grocery store setting for a variety of supplemental food including canned food, dry goods, produce, meat, dairy, frozen food, and bread, when available. Shoppers choose what they take home. Registered clients are able to access the food pantry once every 30 days.

Food Pantry Eligibility Requirements

- Valid Government issued ID
- Clarity Card
- Proof of Residence with address dated within 30 days of visit (recent rent receipt, utility bill, etc.)
- For Children under 18 years old, bring original birth certificates and social security cards
- Proof of low income, such as Medicaid or SNAP Benefits paperwork

WIC Program

The WIC Program is a Supplemental Food Program for Women, Infants and Children. WIC provides nutritional education and referrals to health and public agencies to pregnant women and families with children up to the age of five. Funded through the Nevada State Health Division, WIC strives to improve the health of eligible Nevada residents.

WIC Eligibility Requirements

- Be a Nevada Resident
- Moderately low income or receiving TANF, Medicaid or Food Stamps
- Be a pregnant or recently pregnant woman, infant, or child up to the age of 5
- Complete nutritional assessment at first WIC clinic visit

With 524 beds available, this year-round emergency night shelter provides a clean and safe environment for adult men every night. Laundered linens, showers, toilets, restroom facilities, and toiletries, when available, are provided. Additionally, case management is available every night to provide access to community resources.

Recognizing that independence is achieved one step at a time, Renewing Hope Program For Men offers a structured environment for homeless men who want to gain self-sufficiency through employment. This structured work/living program offers sleeping quarters, access to our dining facility, one-on-one case management, life skills classes, job readiness education, and support groups. For men suffering from opioid addiction, the Paula Marie Davis Medically Assisted Treatment Program is also available.
