Meals on Wheels delivers a set of seven frozen, nutritious meals once a week, to homebound seniors 60 years of age or older. The meals are prepared on site and designed to meet the nutritional needs of seniors. Meals on Wheels service recipients with additional nutrition needs may be referred to our **Medical Nutrition Therapy Program** for an individualized nutrition intervention. Meals on Wheels' delivery drivers also make weekly wellness check-ups on our clients.
